DUCKS LOOK TO REPEAT BANNER YEAR

Oregon enters the 2012-13 season after matching its best finish in school history a season ago. The 2011-12 Ducks captured third place at the NCAA Championships after a runner-up finish at the NCAA Regionals.

Head coach Casey Martin returns for this seventh year at the helm of the Oregon men's golf program this season. Also back with him from last year's squad is assistant coach Brad Lanning and 13 letterwinners, including redshirt senior Robbie Ziegler, who has appeared in 38 career tournaments.

In the 2012 National Semifinals, Oregon's bid to upset top-ranked Texas came up one hole short in the Longhorns' 3-2 victory over the Ducks.

"We played incredibly good golf and even the guys who lost played really well," Martin said after the match. "Texas was just a stroke or two better than us that day and I give them all the credit in the world because I think we made them earn it."

Seventh Year

Stanford '95

PGA Tour veteran, former NCAA Champion and Eugene native Casey Martin enters his seventh season in 2012-13 after amassing one of the Ducks' impressive resumes in any sport.

In his short tenure, he has transformed Oregon into a national golf power, and guided the team to four NCAA Championship appearances the past five years.

In that span, UO has tied for the lead at the end of regulation of the Pac-12 Championships the last two seasons, and scored a third-runner-up effort in '09. In NCAA Regional play, Oregon has been equally up to par with one title (2010) and three runner-up efforts (2008, '09, '12) among its six straight appearances.

The most recent campaign in 2011-12 was arguably the Ducks' greatest ever and featured a record six team wins among their 12 stroke-play events, and an even more amazing postseason run.

In the collegiate finale in L.A., UO matched its best-ever finish among its 25 NCAA trips with a third-place tie. The Ducks lost their hard-fought semifinal to No.1-ranked and eventual national champion Texas, 3-2, at the Riviera Country Club.

Earlier in the week, Oregon beat No. 5 UCLA, 3-2, in the quarterfinals, and stood seventh in stroke play (291-294-288-873) after it sported three individuals in the top 30 overall (Eugene Wong, 13th, 215 (-1); Daniel Miernicki, 21st, 216 (+2); Andrew Vizarro, 29th, 217 (+2)).

Two weeks before in the Ann Arbor NCAA Regional, the Ducks equaled their best-ever finish (second) after they ended one stroke behind USC. Not surprisingly, Oregon featured all five individuals in the top 45 overall - Miernicki (second, 206 (-7)); Jonathan Woo (seventh, 208 (-5)), Wong (19th, (E)), Vizarro (28th, +2)) and Robbie Ziegler (45th, +9)).

In the Pac-12 Championships two weeks prior, UO tied its best-ever league finish and placed second in a two-hole playoff to California. The two teams ended the six-count-five, four-round event tied at 12-under after regulation at the Tysting Tree Golf Club in Corvallis.

In the event that featured six teams ranked top 13 nationally, Miernicki placed second individually (-11) - two strokes shy of the win. Wong trailed once place back in third (-9)), and both posted career-best league placings, while two other Ducks followed in a tie for 21st place - Vizarro and Ziegler.

In return for their historic play all season long, the Ducks amassed a host of individual accolades in 2011-12.

Wong picked up his second Pac-12 Golfer of the Year, All-Nicklaus Team and PING All-America First Team honors. Miernicki joined Wong on the top PING All-America squad - his first, first-team nod after he earned second-team honors as a sophomore. Both were

also tabbed to the All-Pac-12 First Team, while Vizarro earned his second honorable mention (and was a second-team choice in '11).

Two years before, Martin was honored by his league peers as the 2010 Pac-12 Coach of the Year after another ground-breaking campaign.

That season, he led the Ducks to a then-school-record five tournament victories, including Oregon's first-ever NCAA Regional title, and a third-place tie in the NCAA Men's Golf Championships in Chattanooga, Tenn. After securing a spot in the final eight with a fifth-place finish through the stroke play portion of the championships, the Ducks defeated Pac-10 rival Washington, 3-2, in the quarterfinals of match play.

Oregon's historic run was ended on The Honors Course by Oklahoma State, which took the semifinal 3-1-1.

Eugene Wong was tabbed the co-Pac-10 Golfer of the Year, won the Jack Nicklaus Award as the Division I player of the year, and was named a first-team PING All-American. Wong's tie for ninth at the NCAA Championships is believed to be the best finish ever by a UO golfer.

Not surprisingly, the Ducks have shined since the start of his head coaching tenure, as the Ducks won the 2006 Northwest Collegiate Classic - his second event at the helm. The following spring, Oregon also claimed the 2007 Thunderbird Invitational title at Arizona State for the first time in school history.

Glancing at the program record books since 1993-94 only confirms the obvious, as his teams have staked 11 individual tourney wins, and own the:

- top five individual season scoring averages
- five of the top six low individual tournament scores
- three top career individual totals for rounds of par or better
- 20 of the top 28 low individual rounds
- top four season tallies for rounds of par or better
- 14 of the top 19 low team rounds
- 14 of the top 17 low 54-hole tourney team totals vs. par
- 6 of the 7 best team season scoring averages

The golf community is equally familiar with Martin's esteemed accomplishments as a player.

A graduate of South Eugene High School, Martin was a three time all-conference selection, a two-time All-American at Stanford and member of its 1994 NCAA Championship squad. As a senior, he received Academic All-America honors in 1995 and graduated with a degree in economics.

He played professionally starting in 1998 and earned his PGA Tour card in 2000. During that year, he recorded five top-50 finishes, and his best showing was a tie for 17th in the Tucson Open. Other career highlights include an impressive 23rd-place tie in the 1998 U.S. Open.

Even though he re-directed his love for the sport as a collegiate coach in the fall of 2005, he flashed his undeniable athletic skill seven years later in June, 2012.

After winning the local 2012 U.S. Open qualifier at Emerald Valley,



he returned to the nation's toughest golf test at the Olympic Club in San Francisco two weeks later. In his first elite appearance in nearly a decade, the soft-spoken fan favorite became the event's most heart-warming story, and his nine-over score (74-75-149) was only one stroke shy of the midway cut.

The 40-year-old Martin is also known for his court battle with the PGA Tour over the right to use a golf cart in competition. Martin suffers from a birth defect in his right leg known as Klippel-Trenaunay-Webber Syndrome, a congenital circulatory disorder. Under the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Martin won the right to use a golf cart in a legal case with the PGA that went all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court.

His efforts in that landmark case earned him the 1998 Ben Hogan Award, given annually to a competitor who continues to be active in golf despite a physical handicap. In 2001, Nike began bestowing an annual Casey Martin Award to recognize a disabled athlete.

Martin, whose brother Cameron was a member of Oregon's golf team in the early 1990s, has also been named Time magazine person of the week (2001) and New Mobility magazine person of the year (2002).

He is the ninth man to hold the head coaching position at the University of Oregon. He succeeded Steve Nosler, whom he served under as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2005-06 season.

Martin's dedication to the sport of golf, Eugene and the University of Oregon has made him a perfect fit for the UO golf program. Having learned many invaluable lessons throughout his playing days, Martin is now eager to pass them on to Oregon's players.

Brad Lanning returns to Oregon in 2012-13 for his second season.

The Ducks ranked top 15 nationally all year long, and logged a record six team wins among their 12 stroke-play events, then rattled off an even more amazing postseason run.

In the collegiate finale in L.A., UO matched its best-ever finish among its 25 NCAA trips with a third-place tie. The Ducks lost their hard-fought semifinal to No.1-ranked and eventual national champion Texas, 3-2, at the Riviera Country Club.

Earlier in the week, Oregon beat No. 5 UCLA, 3-2, and stood seventh in stroke play (291-294-288-873) after it sported three individuals in the top 30 overall (Eugene Wong, 13th, 215 (-1); Daniel Miernicki, 21st, 216 (+2); Andrew Vijarro, 29th, 217 (+2)).

In return for their historic play all season long, the Ducks amassed a host of individual accolades in 2011-12.

Wong picked up his second Pac-12 Golfer of the Year, All-Nicklaus and PING All-America First Team honors. Miernicki joined Wong on the top PING All-America squad - his first, first-team nod after he earned second-team honors as a sophomore. Both were also tabbed to the All-Pac-12 First Team, while Vijarro earned his second honorable mention (and was a second-team choice in '11).

Lanning joined the staff in June of 2011 with a resume that already included professional playing experience and notable accomplishments as a high school coach.

"I'm really excited to have Brad be a part of our program," Martin said. "He's an extremely talented coach with an awesome personality, and really connects with our players. He is a very well-rounded individual and adds a lot to our program in so many ways." Lanning and Martin first worked together as teammates for three

seasons at Stanford and helped the Cardinal win the 1994 NCAA Championship. After college, Lanning spent six years playing professionally with stints on the Hooters Tour, South American Tour and Canadian PGA, and also worked as a stock broker before entering the coaching ranks.

"I have a great passion for teaching and coaching," Lanning said. "I know what it's like to be in collegiate student-athlete, and I really enjoy mentoring and providing guidance on and off the golf course."

Success came quickly for Lanning as a high school assistant coach with a state title and runner-up finish in two years at St. Stephen's Episcopal School in Bradenton, Fla. After relocating to Colorado to enter a master's program at Denver Seminary, Lanning assisted Valor Christian High School to a pair of state championships in his three seasons with the team.

He has also served on camp coaching staffs for the University of Florida and his alma mater.

A 1994 Stanford graduate with a degree in Political Science, Lanning, 41, earned his master's in Counseling at Denver Seminary in 2011.



One of three seniors for Ducks in 2012-13, and has played five collegiate events for the Ducks career-wise (freshman 2, sophomore 1, junior 2). Logged his career best round - an even 72 - and his best tourney total in the 2010 Oregon Duck Invitational as a freshman (80-72-76-228 (+12)). Away from the competitive circuit, played key acting part in the viral Oregon Men's Golf internet video 'Faster, Stronger, Bigger Golfer' released in April for the O-Heroes Talent Show.

2012-13: Participated in 12 rounds during the 2012-13 fall season ... Finished in a tie for 10th at the St. Mary's Invitational and shot a career-low 68 at the same event.

2011-12: Played two events as an individual for the Ducks, both in the spring. Recorded his season-low round - a one-over - in the finale of his first spring event, the Bandon Dunes Championship (61st-tie, 76-84-72-232 (+19)). Two weeks later, made his third career appearance in the Oregon Duck Invitational (62nd-tie, 81-74-76-231 (+15)).

2010-11: Finished in a tie for 55th at The Duck Invitational with 11-over 227 (77-75-75), while playing as an individual.

2009-10: Lone appearance came in the fall in the junior varsity Washington National as an individual.

PREP: Three-year first team all-Metro League selection for Sunset High School. Also lettered in basketball twice for Sunset, which won the league title in 2008. Attended the University of Arizona in 2008-09, but did not play golf.

One of four Duck upperclassmen on squad in 2012-13, and career-wise has played four events (freshman 2; junior 2). His career-best placing, round (a two-under 70) and tournament score (+10 over) came in the 2012 Oregon Duck Invitational (35th, 77-70-77-224 (+10)). Played a key acting part in the team's internet-craze team video (Faster, Stronger Bigger, Golfer) for the 2012 O-Heroes Talent competition.

2012-13: Shot a season-low 71 in the second round of the Kikkor Husky Invitational en route to a 31st-place finish.

2011-12: Played two events as an individual for the Ducks, both in the spring. In the Oregon Duck Invitational (35th-tie, 77-70-77-224 (+10)), he logged his first under-par collegiate round at the par-72 Eugene Country Club. Two weeks prior in his season debut in the video Bandon Dunes Championship (72nd-tie, 81-75-80). His second-round score at Bandon was one stroke off his then-career-best round (+3) from his freshman campaign.

2009-10: In the spring, made first varsity appearance in the Duck Invitational, and also played one fall event, the junior varsity Washington National Individual.

PREP: Nationally-ranked junior player by Golfweek (No. 152) and JR Golf Scoreboard (No. 178). Helped lead Marist High School to the OSAA state championship as a freshman and a junior. Also helped the Spartans take second in 2007 and third in 2009. Shot 150 to finish fourth at the state tournament as a sophomore in 2007. As a junior in 2008, took second place (150) in the state and the district champion. Finished second in the 2008 Oregon Junior Stroke Play Championship. Placed sixth (150) in the state as a senior in 2009. High school low round was 67. Four-time first team all-state selection. Was also a second team all-state midfielder for the Marist soccer team.

Canby High School

Returns as the team's most experienced player after playing 38 tournaments (Jr. 13, So. 12, Fr. 13) and 110 career rounds (Jr. 34,

So. 36, Fr. 40) in stroke play. Is also one of the team's most tested postseason veterans with two NCAA Championship, two NCAA Regional and three Pac-12 appearances already. In his three prior seasons, was one of four upperclassmen that helped the Ducks ranked top 15 nationally all season in 2011-12, tie for the Pac-12 Championships lead at the end of regulation, place second in the Ann Arbor NCAA Regional and win tournament titles in six of their 12 stroke-play events.

2012-13: Placed ninth at the Alister MacKenzie Invitational.

2011-12: Was one of five Ducks ranked top 250 nationally by Golfstat at season's end (236th, 73.46), while the team stood fifth overall (73.457). In April, he staked his third top-25 Pac-12 finish thanks to a pair of rounds at par or better on the Trysting Tree Golf Course in Corvallis (21st, 72-74-71-74-291 (+3)).
