

Season Review

ELITE 8 & PAC-10 TOURNEY TITLE

One of the best seasons in Oregon basketball history came to an end with an 85-77 loss to eventual NCAA Champion Florida in the Midwest Regional final, but not before the Ducks won the 2007 Pac-10 tournament and advanced to the NCAA Elite 8, both for the second time this decade. The squad set a number of impressive team and individual benchmarks. Here's a look at those accomplishments and some of the telling numbers from Oregon's 2006-07 season.

29 WINS

Oregon's 29 wins were tied with the 1938-39 NCAA Champions for the second-most in school history. It was also Oregon's highest win total in 62 years -- since the 1944-45 team set the school record with 30, when the Ducks played an NCAA record 45 games.

PAC-10 SCORING CHAMP

Aaron Brooks won the 2006-07 Pac-10 scoring title to become Oregon's first league scoring champion since Terrell Brandon averaged a school-record 26.6 points per game in 1990-91. Brooks' 27 points in the NCAA Midwest Regional Final versus Florida upped his season average to 17.7 points per game, allowing the Seattle, Wash., native to edge USC's Nick Young, who averaged 17.5 points per game.

NBA DRAFT

Brooks became the fifth Duck -- and fourth first rounder -- to be drafted during the Ernie Kent era when he was selected 26th overall by the Houston Rockets. He joins Bryan Bracey (2001), Fred Jones (2002), Luke Ridnour (2003) and Luke Jackson (2004).

BROOKS GETS ALL-AMERICA NODS

Senior guard Aaron Brooks won ESPN's men's three-point shooting contest held in Atlanta in conjunction with the NCAA Final Four. He also garnered All-America honors from the Associated Press, The Sporting News and the Wooden Award, becoming Oregon's first Wooden Award team honoree since Greg Ballard in 1977.

PORTER SHOOTs DOWN 3s MARKS

Tajuan Porter set the UO overall single-season and Pac-10 freshman single-season records for three-pointers. The Detroit, Mich., native hit 110 threes in 2006-07. The old Oregon record was 94 by Orlando Williams in 1995, and the old Pac-10 rookie mark was 82 by UCLA's Jason Kapono -- the 2007 NBA three-point champion -- in 2000. Further, his

110 threes were the second most ever by a freshman in NCAA history (Davidson's Stephen Curry made 120 in 2006-07).

DUCKs SET PAC-10 3s MARK, TOO

Oregon made 350 three-pointers in 2006-07, breaking the previous school and Pac-10 record of 304 made in 2002-03. The Ducks' 897 three-point attempts were also school and Pac-10 records.

ANOTHER TICKET FOR PORTER

Tajuan Porter set the UO freshman scoring record during the NCAA Regional Semifinal versus Nevada-Las Vegas, becoming the first Duck frosh to surpass 500 points. He finished the season with 512 points.

ONE MORE TAJUAN RECORD

Porter broke the Oregon record for points in an NCAA Tournament game with 33 versus UNLV. The old mark was 32 by Fred Jones versus Kansas in 2002.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Oregon was 14-5 in games decided by eight points or less (10-4 in Pac-10 games). Ten of the Ducks' 11 Pac-10 wins came by eight points or less. Compare that to 2005-06 when Oregon was 2-14 in such contests.

500-POINT SEASONS

Aaron Brooks, Bryce Taylor and Tajuan Porter became the 16th, 17th and 18th different Ducks, respectively, to score 500 points in a season. Brooks finished the year seventh all-time with 621 points,

while Taylor was 20th with 523 and Porter 24th at 512. It marked just the second time in school history (2002) that three different Ducks scored 500 points.

TAYLOR PERFECT

Bryce Taylor set Pac-10 Tournament records by making 11-of-11 field goal and 7-of-7 3-point field goal attempts in scoring a career-best 32 points in the Pac-10 tournament championship win against USC.

30-POINT CLUB

Aaron Brooks, Tajuan Porter and Bryce Taylor each scored 30 points in a game during 2006-07. That was the first time three different Ducks had a 30-point game in the same year since 1975-76.

TOP 10 WINS

Oregon was the only school in the country that defeated three different top 10 teams in 2006-07 -- No. 1 UCLA, No. 10 Arizona and No. 9 Washington State. It was the first time in school history that Oregon knocked off three top 10 teams in the same season.

LUCKY 7

The Ducks won a school-record seven games versus ranked teams in 2006-07. Overall, Oregon was 7-3 versus the top-25. The Ducks defeated No. 18 Georgetown (Nov. 29), No. 1 UCLA (Jan. 6), No. 10 Arizona (Jan. 14), No. 20 Washington State (Jan. 27), No. 9 Washington State (Feb. 22), No. 22 Winthrop (March 18) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament and No. 19 UNLV (March 23) in the NCAA regional semifinals.

ROAD WARRIORS

Oregon was 13-6 away from Eugene (6-5 road, 7-1 neutral). Three of Oregon's seven wins over ranked opponents came on the road. It was the first time in school history that Oregon defeated three ranked opponents on the road in the same season.

SHARP SHOOTERS

Oregon led the Pac-10 and ranked ninth nationally in three-point field goals per game (9.5). The Ducks were also second in the conference and fifth nationally in free throw percentage (.761).

PLAYING PERCENTAGES

Oregon was 25-3 when the opponent shot below 50 percent from the field and 4-5 when foes reached 50 percent.

CLUTCH DUCKS


Seven times this season, Oregon scored the game-winning or game-tying points in the final minute of regulation. Four different players -- including Aaron Brooks, of course -- stepped up in the limelight.

BROOKS NETS 30 FOUR TIMES

Feb. 24 versus Washington, SR G Aaron Brooks scored 30 points -- his fourth 30-point game of the 2006-07 season and fifth career. He is one of only five Ducks to record four or more 30-point games in one season. Terrell Brandon last accom-

plished that feat in 1990-91 with eight. The others are Stan Love (8/1970-71 and 5/1969-70), Greg Ballard (4/1976-77) and Charlie Warren (4/1961-62). Only Love (13), Brandon (9), Ron Lee (7) and Ballard (6) finished with more career 30-point games at Oregon than Brooks.

BIG SHOT BROOKS

Aaron Brooks scored the points that either won or tied the game in the final minute or overtime six times in 2006-07. Here's a look at Brooks' clutch performances:

MAARTY'S BOARDS

Maarty Leunen's 304 rebounds were the most by an Oregon player in 31 years. His 18 rebounds Dec. 23 versus Mercer was the most by a Duck in 17 seasons. Leunen opened the year with back-to-back double-doubles, including a 17-rebound game against Cal State Northridge.

BACK IN MAC

Oregon has a 76-19 record at McArthur Court over the last six seasons. The 16 home wins in 2006-07 tied the school season record at the venerable 80-year-old facility.

DUCKS KNOCK OFF NO. 1

The Jan. 6 68-66 win against No. 1 UCLA marked the third time in program history that Oregon defeated the nation's top-ranked team. Prior to that, the Ducks' last win over a No. 1 team was Feb. 16, 1974, when Oregon upset UCLA 56-51.

DESERT SWEEP

Oregon swept its trip to the desert for the first time in school history. The Ducks had never come away with a pair of wins on the Arizona road trip since the Wildcats and Sun Devils joined the league prior to the 1978-79 season (28 trips).

BIG EAST WIN

On Nov. 29, Oregon defeated No. 18 Georgetown 57-50. It marked the first time the Ducks ever defeated a ranked non-conference opponent on the road, as well as their first win over a ranked opponent in the Eastern time zone (8 games).

LATE RALLY AT RICE

The Ducks rallied from an eight-point deficit in the final minute of regulation Nov. 20 versus Rice, scoring nine points in :37 to tie the game at 66-66, before winning 79-73 in overtime.

PORTER-RIFIC!

Freshman Tajuan Porter had a season-opening weekend for the record books, highlighted by his 38 points on a school and Pac-10 record 10 3-pointers Nov. 12 versus Portland State. He was named Dick Vitale's national player of the week for his efforts.

TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS

Winning the Pac-10 tournament title in 2007 by crushing USC 81-57, the Ducks became the only team to have won the Pac-10 tourney title twice since it was brought back in 2002. Oregon is now 12-7 all-time in Pac-10 tournament games, and 10-3 under Ernie Kent, who has the overall best career winning percentage in tournament games at .769, and has more tournament victories (10) than anyone except Arizona's Lute Olson (16). Coincidentally Oregon faced four consecutive conference tournament champions in the 2007 NCAA Tournament in Miami, Ohio (Mid-American), Winthrop (Big South), Nevada-Las Vegas (Mountain West) and Florida (SEC).

NCAA NOTES

Oregon is now 12-8 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and 6-4 under current head coach Ernie Kent (four appearances). Oregon made its ninth NCAA Tournament appearance in school history in 2007. The third-seeded Ducks advanced to the regional finals for the fourth time in school history (1939, 1960, 2002, 2007) by defeating Miami (Ohio) 58-56 in the first round, Winthrop 75-51 in the second round and Nevada-Las Vegas 76-72 in the regional semifinal before falling to eventual NCAA Champion Florida 85-77 in the Midwest Regional Final.

TIED FOR THIRD

Tying for third in the Pac-10 with Arizona and USC (11-7) meant Oregon finished among the league's top three for just the fourth time since the conference expanded to 10 teams prior to the 1978-79 season. Three of those seasons have come under head coach Ernie Kent: 2000 (3rd), 2002 (1st) and 2007. The Ducks were also third in 1984.

ELITE CLUB

Oregon is one of 15 schools that has advanced to the NCAA Regional Finals twice this decade. Here is that list of basketball's elite:

RANKINGS RECORD

The Ducks were ranked No. 10 in the final regular season Associated Press poll. That marked the school-record 14th consecutive week Oregon had been ranked in the same season. The previous mark was 12 consecutive weeks to start the 2002-03 season. Overall, Oregon's longest consecutive streak being ranked by the Associated Press is 18 weeks spanning the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons.

PAC-10 HONORS

Three Ducks, Aaron Brooks, Maarty Leunen and Tajuan Porter, were recognized by the league's coaches. Brooks, the Pac-10's leading scorer, was named to the all-Pac-10 first team, Leunen was an all-Pac-10 honorable mention selection and Porter was a Pac-10 all-freshman pick. Brooks was Oregon's first all-conference player since Luke Jackson in 2004. Porter's selection continued a recent trend of Pac-10 all-freshmen for the Ducks. He was Oregon's sixth in the last seven seasons. Three Ducks also made the Pac-10 all-tournament team: Brooks, Porter and Bryce Taylor, with Porter being named the tournament's most outstanding player.

1,000 POINT TEAMMATES

Malik Hairston, Aaron Brooks and Bryce Taylor all reached 1,000 career points during the 2006-07 season. It was the first time ever that Oregon had three 1,000-point teammates sharing the floor at the same time. They joined Stan Love and Bill Drozdiak (1971), Ron Lee and Greg Ballard (1976), and Luke Ridnour and Luke Jackson (2003) as Oregon's only other 1,000-point teammates.

DUCKS' BEST MARK SINCE 1939

Oregon's 29-8 mark (.784) was its best since the Tall Firs' team that won the NCAA Championship in 1938-39 (68 years earlier). That squad reached 29-5 (.853) in defeating Ohio State to claim the national title. Oregon's 13-0 start was the best under Ernie Kent and the school's best in 69 years -- since going 14-0 in 1937-38. It was also just the third 13-0 start in school history.

CLUTCH DUCKS

Seven times in 2006-07, the Ducks scored the game-winning or game-tying points in the final minute of regulation. Four different players came through in the limelight -- proving senior guard Aaron Brooks wasn't the only "Big Shot" on the team. Here's a look:

DOUBLE DIGIT BOARDS

Six different Ducks grabbed at least 10 rebounds in a game. Maarty Leunen had a team-high 11 double-figure rebound games. Malik Hairston added three, Aaron Brooks had two, while Bryce Taylor, Adam Zahn and Joevan Catron all had one double-digit rebounding game. Four times, Oregon had two double-digit rebounders in one game -- Leunen (12) and Taylor (12) Nov. 20 at Rice, Leunen (18) and Zahn (11) Dec. 23 against Mercer, Leunen (14) and Catron (17) Dec. 28 against Portland and Hairston (11) and Leunen (10) March 23 versus Nevada-Las Vegas.

BROOKS' BROTHERS

Aaron Brooks finished his career as one of just five Ducks ranked in the UO career top 10 in points, assists and steals. The other members of that club: Luke Jackson (2001-04), Fred Jones (1998-01), Kenya Wilkins (1994-97) and Anthony Taylor (1985-88).

TEAM AND MAC RECORDS SET

The Ducks tied the McArthur Court scoring record with 116 points Nov. 12 versus Portland State. Oregon originally established that mark Dec. 23, 1974, versus Villanova. Oregon also set a McArthur Court record for points in a half when the Ducks scored 68 in the second period against Portland State. The previous mark was 64 in that aforementioned Villanova game.

MAC TURNS 80

The 2006-07 season marked the 80th birthday of venerable McArthur Court -- Jan. 14, 2007 (Oregon won at No. 10 Arizona on that date). In 80 years at Mac, Oregon has won 684 games. Over the last six years, the Ducks have a 76-19 record at home.

TAJUAN-DERFUL!

Nov. 12 versus Portland State, Tajuan Porter broke Ron Lee's UO freshman scoring record when he went off for 38 points. Lee's freshman mark, which stood for nearly 34 seasons, was 31 points set against UCLA, Feb. 23, 1973. The Detroit, Mich., native's record-setting performance came one night after scoring 28 points versus Cal State Northridge and two nights after lighting up Lehigh for 27 points. Porter recorded four of the top seven freshman scoring performances in school history during the 2006-07 season. The top eight:

1. **38 points, Tajuan Porter (vs. Portland State, 11/12/06)**
2. **33 points, Tajuan Porter (vs. UNLV, 3/23/07)**
3. 31 points, Ron Lee (vs. UCLA, 2/23/73)
4. 28 points, Johnnie Reece (at Washington State, 2/22/92)
28 points, Tajuan Porter (vs. Cal State Northridge, 11/11/06)
5. 27 points, Orlando Williams (at California, 3/14/92)
6. **27 points, Tajuan Porter (vs. Lehigh, 11/10/06)**
7. 26 points, Bryce Taylor (at Washington State, 1/15/05)

Among Pac-10 freshmen, Porter's 38 points was third best all-time, and only three shy of the Pac-10 record of 41,

set by UCLA's Don MacLean in 1988. Here's that top four:

1. 41 points, Don MacLean, UCLA (vs. North Texas, 12/30/1988)
2. 39 points, Cliff Robinson, USC (vs. California, 2/2/1978)
3. **38 points, Tajuan Porter, Oregon (vs. Portland State, 11/12/2006)**
4. 35 points, Mario Bennett, Arizona State (vs. Arizona, 2/20/1992)

Porter also broke school and McArthur Court records with his 10 three pointers against the Vikings. The previous school mark was eight by Orlando Williams (11/26/1994 vs. Wisconsin-Green Bay) and Jamal Lawrence (1/16/1997 vs. Stanford). Brian Wright of Washington State (2/21/1988) also shared the previous Mac Court record.

The 10 three-pointers tied the Pac-10 single-game record set by Arizona State's Stevin Smith, a mark he set twice, including a Jan. 30, 1993, game versus Oregon in Tempe.

Porter's 38 points was five shy of Greg Ballard's school record 43 (3/9/1977 vs. Oral Roberts). It was the most scored by an Oregon player since Luke Jackson's memorable 40-point NIT game versus Colorado, 3/17/2004.

A CAPITOL VISIT

During the Ducks' trip to play Georgetown in Washington, D.C., the team took some time out to visit with U.S. Senator Ron Wyden (D-Ore.), who held a 45 minute Q&A session with the team in the Dirksen Senate Office Building, and then led the group on a tour of the U.S. Capitol, including a rare stop on the floor of the U.S. Senate. Wyden, who played basketball for UC Santa Barbara in the 1960s, was also a member of the vocal Verizon Center crowd that witnessed the Ducks' 57-50 upset of the Hoyas the next night. During the tour of the Capitol, the team was surprised in the National Statuary Hall by an appearance by legendary Senator Robert C. 

Diminutive but destructive Tajuan Porter, the shortest man on the floor at 5-foot-6, broke open a close game by making his first four shots of the second half, all from long range. That spurt, Aaron Brooks' 22 points and a smothering defense led Oregon over the frazzled Winthrop Eagles 75-61 and eliminated the last remaining double-digit seed from the tournament. The third-seeded Ducks, who have won more games than any Oregon team since the 1944-45 squad won 30, moved on, largely because of super-sized, 11-for-23 shooting from 3-point range that was almost as hot as the fluorescent yellow uniforms they wore. While Porter and Brooks led the way, the Ducks also got solid efforts from Malik Hairston (13 points) and Maarty Leunen (12), while Joevan Catron's six points was a boost off the bench. Oregon also relied on its relentless, speedy defense to control the game. A frenzy of reaching, probing Ducks greeted every Winthrop pass near the basket, resulting in 15 Eagle turnovers.

After Porter and Hairston hit back-to-back 3-pointers to make it 66-49 with 5:23 to play, UNLV began chipping away. Kevin Kruger and Michael Umeh combined for 13 points during a 17-4 run that got the Runnin' Rebels within 70-66 with 50.2 seconds to play. But Porter hit 4-of-6 from the line in the last 41 seconds. Lee Humphrey made seven 3-pointers and finished with 23 points, and Taurean Green added 21 to lead the Gators to an 85-77 victory over third-seeded Oregon in the Midwest Regional final. Oregon was trying to get to the Final Four for the first time since winning it all in 1939, the first year of the NCAA tournament. Aaron Brooks led Oregon with 27 points, and Malik Hairston added 18 and five rebounds before fouling out with 3:54 to play. Brooks made a 3-pointer and followed with a layup to tie the game at 45 with 17:06 to play. But Green made a 3, then scored on a driving layup that gave the Gators a 50-45 lead with 16:18 to play. After a timeout, Humphrey hit a 3 to make it 53-47 with 15:35 to play. The Ducks then made interesting by holding Florida without a field goal in the last 8:14. The Gators also missed seven free throws in the last two minutes, allowing Oregon to whittle a nine-point deficit down to four.
