## BIO

2015 (RS-Senior): Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention ... started all 19 matches and logged 1,402 minutes ... played at both defender and midfielder during the season ... scored her lone goal of the season against Air Force on Sept. 11 off a free kick to put Oregon up 2-0 in the 28th minute. The goal was the only one of the season for the Ducks that came directly off the free-kick service ... was one of two captains on the team ... letterwinner.

2014 (RS-Junior): Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention ... played in 17 games, started in five for a total of 692 minutes ... scored her first-career goal in a tie against then No. 18 Arizona State on a penalty kick ... tallied her first-career assist against Eastern Michigan to give the Ducks their second tie of the year ... letterwinner.

2013 (Junior): Did not see action in the 2013 season, redshirted.

2012 (Sophomore): A Pac-12 All-Academic honoree ... A strong part of the Ducks' back line playing in 15 matches and starting in four ... Recorded six shots including two against Gonzaga (Sept. 16), one of which was a goal ... Tallied 522 minutes of playing time ... letterwinner.

2011 (Freshman): Played in all 19 matches, 12 of which she started ... Ranked fifth on the team in shots with 16, and tied for sixth in shots on goal with 3 ... Logged 964 minutes of playing time as a rookie ... letterwinner.

## BIO

2015 (Senior): Made the switch to center back in her final season ... started all 19 games and logged the most minutes on the team with 1,752 ... Helped the Ducks' defense limit their opponents to fewer than 10 shots 10 different times during the season and fewer than five shots on goals 13 times ... Had a season-high three shots, all of which were on frame, against USC ... one of two captains on the team ... letterwinner.

2014 (Junior): Started all 15 games that she played in and logged 1,276 minutes ... finished third on the team in points with six (2 assists, 2 goals) ... took the second-most shots on the team (26) ... also was tied for second on the team in goals (2) ... tallied assists in wins over Saint Mary's and Utah ... scored her first goal of the season in a win over Loyola Marymount ... notched her second goal in a win over Colorado ... only her and Lilly Archer scored multiple goals and assists on the season ... letterwinner.

2013 (Sophomore): Started in all 19 matches ... logged 1,393 minutes as a forward ... led the team in goal scoring for a second-straight season, tying ShayLee Miner with three goals ... tied for second on the team with six points ... became the fourth UO player to lead the team in goals in consecutive seasons .. scored her first goal of the season in the 29th minute against Washington ... scored Oregon's lone goal against No. 12 Stanford with a 70th minute strike ... tallied the Ducks' earliest goal of the season with a 4th minute score against USC ... after being held scoreless in the first 13 games of the season, she tallied a goal in three of the next four ... took the second most shots on the team with 26 ... recorded a shot in 16-of-19 matches ... letterwinner.

2012 (Freshman) : A stand-out freshman for the Ducks who started all 19 of the matches she played ... led the team with 14 points and seven goals ... contributed a multi-goal effort (2) in the season opener against UAB (Aug. 19) ... took 20 shots of which 16 were on goal ... scored the decisive goal three times: UAB (Aug. 19), Portland State (Aug. 26) and USC (Oct. 7) ... recorded the most playing time of any freshman on the team with 1,482 minutes played ... letterwinner.

High School: Integral part of varsity soccer, basketball and golf programs since freshman year ... maintained a 3.95 overall GPA including honors classes in English, math and history ... The Summit varsity soccer team won the Oregon 5A State Championship in 2010, after losing in the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds in 2009 and 2008 ... as a starting forward in all her years, was voted team MVP as a freshman and team offensive player of the year as a sophomore and junior ... was Inter-Mountain Conference (IMC) Player of the Year n 2009 and a first-team selection in 2010 and 2011 ... named to the Oregon 5A All-State team in 2009 and 2010 ... has demonstrated leadership skills throughout her career, being voted team captain in 2010 and 2011 ... has also been the starting point guard for the Summit varsity basketball team since her freshman year ... team won the IMC championship in 2008 and 2009, placing sixth in the State Tournament in 2008 ... served as the team captain in 2010, as well as being tabbed the IMC Defensive Player of the Year ... The Summit varsity golf team fared well during her years, winning the IMC championship and Oregon State 5A championship in all three seasons ... played as the No. 2 player in 2008 and the No. 1 player in 2009 and 2010, finishing fourth and sixth respectively in the individual honors.

ODP/Club: Played on the Oregon Rush 93 Nike Club Team since 2004 that won the OYSA State Championship in 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011 ... team has participated in the US Club Soccer National Cup (2006), the Manchester United Premier Cup (2008) and the Surf Cup (2006, 2007, 2009 and 2010) ... also played for the Oregon ODP team in 2006 and 2007, participating in the Region IV Regional Camp in 2007.





# KAT MERTZ

Head Coach

Third Season | North Carolina State '98

With three seasons at the University of Oregon under her belt, Kat Mertz has the women's soccer program on a steady, ascending climb up the Pac-12 ranks. Under her leadership, the Ducks knocked off two conference rivals in Washington and Oregon State in the back-to-back years for the first time in program history.

The 2015 team was led in scoring by freshmen Marissa Everett and Kyra Fawcett as the duo combined to score seven of UO's 14 goals on the season and five of which were the game-winners. Everett's achievements were recognized by the conference as she was named to the All-Freshman team, the second honoree under Mertz as redshirt freshman Caitlyn Wong garnered the accolade in 2014.

Mertz' direction in the 2014 season molded Oregon into one of the best defensive teams in the Pac-12. With a 1.04 goals against average, the Ducks finished the season with the third-lowest average – best average since the 2006 season – in school history. The team also finished the 2014 season at No. 74 in the final NCAA RPI – giving UO their highest RPI finish since 2009. A former four-year starting goalkeeper at North Carolina State, Mertz helped former Duck goalkeeper Abby Steele cap off her Oregon career first in goals allowed average (1.15) and shutouts (17), and third in goalkeeper wins (21) and saves (307).

At the conclusion of the 2014 season, Steele, along with fellow senior forward Bri Pugh were both named honorable mention All-Pac-12 and center back Caitlyn Wong was named to the Pac-12 All-Freshman team. The three conference honors were the most in one season for the Ducks since 2006.

It's the same story for the Green and Yellow under Mertz in the classroom. Since she took over, UO has had at least seven athletes honored by the Pac-12 for their academic achievements.

This season, Wong garnered first-team honors for the second straight year while sophomore Miranda Schulz was named to the second team. Six other Ducks collected honorable mention accolades.

In 2014, Wong and senior midfielder Lilly Archer earned first-team honors – giving the Ducks two members on the first team for the first time since 2008 – and six other athletes were Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention selections. Mertz' first two years at the helm also saw UO earn the NSCAA Team Academic Award (team grade point average of 3.0 or higher) in both 2013 and 2014.

In her first season in 2013, Mertz and Oregon secured one of the most notable wins in program history, upsetting No. 12 California 1-0, providing the highlight of the season. It was the second-highest ranked opponent UO defeated in program history.

Mertz was named head coach at Oregon on Dec. 21, 2012 after spending the 2012 season as head coach at Saint Louis University. Mertz is the third coach in UO history since the program returned to the varsity level in 1996. Mertz brings extensive experience at the collegiate and national ranks. She has made nine NCAA Tournament appearances in five collegiate coaching stints covering 15 seasons. She has also served on the United States Women's National Youth Team coaching staffs – where she helped guide the U-20 squad to the 2008 FIFA World Cup title – and for Olympic Development Programs.

Prior to taking over at Saint Louis where she led the Billikens to a 5-9-4 record, Mertz served as an assistant coach at Texas and helped guide the Longhorns to the NCAA Tournament in 2010 and 2011. Texas placed nine student-athletes on the All-Big 12 squad and 19 on the Academic All-Conference team during her tenure.

She was also a head coach at UNLV where she spent five seasons from 2005-09. Mertz compiled a 49-39-19 record and led the Rebels to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths, winning back-to-back Mountain West Conference Tournament titles in 2005 and 2006 en route to the postseason. She was named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Rebels to the MWC regular-season crown in 2007.

Mertz coached 17 All-Conference performers at UNLV, including an MWC Co-Offensive Player of the Year, and three All-Region honorees. During her five seasons, the Rebels produced 60 Academic All-Conference selections, three College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District choices and one CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Already familiar with the Pac-12, Mertz was the lead assistant coach at UCLA for five years (2000-04) under the former head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team, Jill Ellis. The Bruins reached the NCAA Tournament round of 16 in each of those seasons and advanced to the NCAA College Cup in 2000, 2003 and 2004. UCLA won three Pac-10 championships and produced numerous All-Americans, Pac-10 Players of the Year and Academic All-Americans during Mertz's time with the program.

Mertz started her collegiate coaching career at Virginia where she was an assistant coach for the 1999 season.

A member of the U.S. Women's National Team's U-20 and U-18 coaching staff since 2007, Mertz helped lead the U-20 squad to the 2008 FIFA World Cup title. She was an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team's U-15 team in its inaugural season in 2004, and last year she became a national scout for the Youth National Team programs.

Mertz served as head coach of the Olympic Development Program Region IV '94 age group team and was the ODP Region IV assistant director of goalkeeping from 2004 to 2010.

Mertz was a four-year starting goalkeeper (1994-97) at North Carolina State, where she helped the Wolfpack qualify for three NCAA Tournaments and reach the 1995 national quarterfinals. A starter in 88 of a possible 90 matches, she owns school records for saves in a career (436) and season (135, 1994) and ranks third in career shutouts (24).

Following her collegiate career, Mertz played two seasons for the Raleigh Wings, a W-1 (top tier) team in the United Soccer Leagues W-League. The Wings were league champions both years.

Mertz earned a bachelor's degree in natural resources, ecosystem assessment, at North Carolina State in 1998. She holds a United States Soccer Federation "A" national coaching license and a National Soccer Coaches Association of America Advanced National Diploma.

Emanuel Martins wrapped up his second season with the University of Oregon women's soccer team as an assistant coach. "Manny" Martins most recently served as the assistant coach of the United States Women's National Under-17 Team. Additionally, Martins has experience in the high school, college, club and semi-professional levels of soccer.

Martins serves as the program's recruiting coordinator in addition to handling various coaching duties.

"After visiting Eugene it was clear to me that coach Mertz's vision is to elevate the women's soccer program to prominence within the Pac-12 and on the national stage, and I immediately knew that I wanted to be a part of it," said Martins. "I was also impressed by the support and resources provided to the student athletes by the department - such as the state-of-the-art academic center - and the truly world class athletic facilities."

In his two seasons on Oregon's staff, the Ducks have beaten Washington in back-to-back years for just the second time in program history and collected a road victory against rival Oregon State, the first win in Corvallis since 2003. UO also has had a freshman named to the Pac-12 All-Freshman team in back-to-back years for just the fourth time in school history and first time since 2011-2012.

In Martins' first season in 2014, Oregon finished the year with their third-lowest goals against average in school history (1.04), defeated Washington for the first time since 2006, had 12 players scored a goal over the course of the season and the team wrapped up the year at No. 74 in the final NCAA RPI, giving the program their highest RPI finish since 2009.

Martins - who was born in Portugal - also brings Pac-12 experience with him to Eugene, having served as an assistant coach at UCLA from 2011-13. With Martins on staff for two seasons, the Bruins posted a 34-4-6 overall record with a 16-3-3 mark in Pac-12 competition. Martins helped lead UCLA to the quarterfinals of the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

With the Bruins, Martins coached a pair of number one draft picks in women's professional soccer; Sydney Leroux (2012/Atlanta Beat/WPS) and Zakiya Bywaters

(2013/Chicago Red Stars/NWSL). Martins also coached four NSCAA All-Americans during his stay in Los Angeles.

Martins then accepted a position with the U.S. U17 team, where he has served as an assistant coach since 2013. He is responsible for identifying, evaluating and training the best prospects in the United States youth ranks. While Martins was with the squad, U.S. scored 45 goals while conceding two in 10 matches. During that time, Martins was also the Los Angeles area liaison for the United States Soccer Federation.

Prior to his stints with U.S. soccer and UCLA, Martins filled multiple roles at the highly successful Los Angeles Premier FC. He was named Director of Coaching and Player Development for the team in 2006, and was named head coach of their WPSL team in 2010. Martins earned WPSL Coach of the Year honors in 2010. Prior to his work with Premier FC, Martins had additional success in the club ranks as the Director of Coaching and Player Development for Los Angeles Rampage FC from 2006-2010.


Martins began his coaching career as an assistant with his alma mater, Sylmar High School, in 1996. He assumed head coaching duties two years later and led the program to a 101-54-22 record in seven seasons. While at Sylmar, Martins served as an assistant coach at Los Angeles Mission College and helped the team to a conference championship, a No. 2 ranking in the state and a No. 3 ranking in the nation. He moved on to Division II Cal Poly Pomona, serving as an assistant coach for three seasons.

After serving for three seasons with Pomona, Martins was named head coach of Los Angeles Mission College. Martins also served as the boys head coach at Granada Hills Charter High School from 2007-10 while at LA Mission.

Martins was born in Portugal and moved to San Fernando, Calif., in 1993. He played soccer at Sylmar High School and LA Mission College. Martins earned a Bachelor's of Science degree in kinesiology at Cal Poly Pomona in 2006 and holds a USSF A License. He is fluent in Portuguese, Spanish, English and Creole.

Tom Serratore completed his first season with the University of Oregon women's soccer team as the volunteer goalkeeper coach.

The 2015 season saw all three keepers on the Ducks' roster receive playing time and the starting job was eventually earned by sophomore Halla Hinriksdóttir, who compiled a 1.17 goals against average (GAA) and made 39 saves in her 14 starts. Her GAA is the fifth-best in program history for a single season and the 16 goals she allowed is tied for the second-lowest margin ever in Oregon soccer single-season history.

Hinriksdóttir was 8th among Pac-12 keepers with a 1.55 GAA in conference matches and both she and fellow keeper Lauren Holden finished 10th in conference shut-outs.

A 2015 graduate of Valparaiso University, Serratore has spent the previous five years as a member of the Crusaders' men's soccer squad.

When he was not competing on the pitch, Serratore was providing instruction at Camp Shutout, Chicago Fire Jr. summer camps and camps being put on by the Valparaiso coaching staff. Serratore was also the junior varsity and varsity summer league coach for his alma mater, Andrew High School.

"Tom is a bright coach who is full of energy and passion for the game," Oregon head coach Kat Mertz said. "We were excited to have him join our Duck staff. He has a good eye for the game and will be able to help develop and push our goalkeepers to be the best in the conference."

Serratore was a decorated high school, club and collegiate athlete. He set the school record for career (21) and consecutive (6) shut-outs while competing at Andrew High School and he won two national championships with his club team, Chicago Magic. He also won a national title while competing with the Illinois ODP team.

While at Valparaiso, Serratore helped lead the squad to the 2011 Horizon League championship and he was also selected to the Horizon League Academic All-

League squad and earned a spot on the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll.

Serratore graduated Valparaiso with a degree in secondary education and kinesiology along with a minor in non-profit promotions in communications.

He was named the inaugural recipient of the Crusader Athletics' prestigious Anderson-Hoffman Memorial Service Award for his community service efforts.

Serratore helped raise over \$150,000 during his tenure at Valparaiso as he worked with the St. Baldrick's Foundation, a non-profit organization that raises money and awareness for childhood cancer research. His tireless work and commitment to fundraising earned him the cover of the summer 2013 issue of NCAA Champion Magazine.

Serratore hails from Tinley Park, Ill. and is a 2010 graduate of Victor J. Andrew High School. He currently resides in Eugene, Ore.

## OREGON SOCCER ACADEMIC SUPPORT STAFF

The academic support team (Services for Student-Athletes) acts as a bridge between the student-athlete and campus resources, ensuring that they are aware of and use the resources the university has to offer. Functions include:

- Advise and assist student-athletes with academic, pre-professional and career situations.
- Organize and monitor a structured study hall. All first-year students are required to attend study sessions four nights each week.
- Track academic progress using information on attendance and performance submitted in mid-term grade reports by faculty.
- Provide individual and group tutoring and other study sessions among students with similar needs, assuring questions are answered properly.

# ROB MULLENS

Athletic Director

Rob Mullens has presided over one of the most successful eras in the University of Oregon's history with Duck student-athletes setting milestone records both on the field and in the classroom. He has guided Oregon to its best finish ever in the Directors' Cup, a national assessment of an athletic department's overall achievements. At the same time, Mullens has improved the Ducks' academic standards to where the University now averages more than 100 academic all-conference selections annually.

And just as important as the athletic and academic success, Oregon's philosophy of fiscal efficiency during Mullens' tenure has been recognized nationwide. The University is one of only a handful of institutions nationwide that is self-sufficient as the Oregon brand continues to grow.

Those three pillars – student-athlete experience, academic excellence and broad-based competitive excellence – comprise the foundation of Mullens' core beliefs as he oversees nearly 500 student-athletes and a budget of nearly \$98 million. Yet Mullens himself would tell you that it is the talented student-athletes, coaches and staff at the University of Oregon that are the department's most valuable assets.

Mullens was named the University's 12th director of intercollegiate athletics on July 15, 2010, after arriving from the University of Kentucky, where he served as deputy director of athletics and managed day-to-day operations for Kentucky's 22-sport athletics department, with an annual operating budget of \$79 million.

Since Mullens' arrival in Eugene, the Duck football team has claimed three conference championships in five seasons and played in the inaugural College Football Playoff Championship Game. The 2015 season saw the coronation of the University's first-ever Heisman Trophy winner, Marcus Mariota, as the Ducks won the Pac-12 title and then defeated undefeated Florida State in the Rose Bowl semifinal game.

Spurred by national championships in men's indoor and outdoor track and field, and women's indoor track and field, as well as top 10 national finishes by softball, football, men's and women's cross country and women's indoor track and field, the Ducks placed 13th in the 2014-15 Directors' Cup final standings, an all-time high for Oregon.

In the history of the Directors' Cup, Oregon is the only program with 18 or fewer NCAA sports to place among the top 15 nationally, a feat the Ducks have done four times. Oregon also ranked among the top 25 for a sixth time in seven years. Ten of the University's 27 all-time national championships have been won in the last five years.

Off the field, Mullens saw three-quarters of UO student-athletes earn degrees, and three garner Capitol One Academic All-America awards. All told, more than 100 student-athletes won academic all-conference awards. Since the opening of the John E. Jaqua Academic Center for Student Athletes in 2010, 29 UO student-athletes have earned Academic All-America honors.

Other highlights of Mullens' tenure include three Women's College World Series appearances for the softball team, a trip to the NCAA championship game in volleyball, three consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament for men's basketball and

a combined total of 10 national championships won by the Duck track and field and cross country squads.

Mullens arrived in Eugene as the Ducks opened their spectacular Matthew Knight Arena, which plays host to the school's men's and women's basketball teams, women's volleyball and acrobatics and tumbling, in addition to benefitting the entire Eugene-Springfield communities as a state-of-the-art venue for concerts, cultural forums and world-class entertainment. Other recent facilities include the Jaqua Center, the Hatfield-Dowling Football Complex and Pape' Field. In 2016, the softball team will open the brand new Jane Sanders Stadium.

Mullens' background is in accounting and auditing, and he promoted sound fiscal management and self-sufficiency at the University of Kentucky. During his total of eight years at Kentucky, the athletic department's operating budget expanded by nearly 70 percent. Fundraising for the department hit record levels each of the past seven years prior to his departure.

Prior to being named deputy director of athletics at Kentucky in 2006, Mullens began as the university's executive associate director of athletics in 2002. He served at the University of Maryland from 1996 to 2002, starting as assistant director of athletics for business and ultimately as executive senior associate director of athletics and chief of staff.

The West Virginia native was senior athletics business manager at the University of Miami (Fla.) from 1994 to 1996, and prior to that he was an accountant/auditor at Ernst & Young in Raleigh, N.C.

The 46-year-old Mullens earned a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's in sport management from West Virginia University in 1991 and 1993, respectively. He and his wife, Jane, have two sons - Cooper and Tanner.


